The year 2023 commenced on a positive note with all Queensland staff, Lead CAs, and Regional Principal Paul Maher participating in the QLD Staff Week. This event provided a comprehensive platform for us to unite as a whole school, engage in professional development in key educational areas, and network with new staff members. We also took the time to reflect on and celebrate the successes of 2022. Teambuilding activities were integral to the week, fostering collaboration and strengthening our team dynamics through various engaging and interactive sessions.

Early in Term 1, we received a visit from the Regional Team, which provided us with the opportunity to showcase our four campuses: highlighting our facilities, programs, and the achievements of our students and staff. The visit facilitated important discussions with all stakeholders, emphasizing our commitment to collaborative leadership, strategic alignment, the promotion of the "Learning to Learn" framework, and cultivating a positive and inclusive school culture. This engagement underscored our dedication to maintaining high standards and continuous improvement across our network.

The past year has been marked by significant accomplishments and developments across various facets of our independent school network. Key highlights include:

Cyclical Review Completion: We successfully completed the rigorous five-year Cyclical Review, demonstrating our adherence to high educational standards and continuous improvement practices.

Development of QWASA: The development of the Queensland, Western Australia, and South Australia (QWASA) collaboration has enhanced teaching and learning across three states at the Year 7-10 level, fostering a unified approach to curriculum delivery and pedagogical practices.

OSG developed Personas to provide a positive framework for all stakeholders — Students, Educators, Campus Principal, Parents, and the Campus Board. The goal is to clarify expectations and encourage all stakeholders to pursue excellence, become the best versions of themselves, and foster a culture of growth and feedback.

As part of our ongoing initiatives, Queensland launched the Head Start program, which offers early academic opportunities for our students, allowing them to begin their learning journey ahead of the traditional schedule. This initiative is designed to provide a head start in their education, fostering a love for learning and academic excellence from an early age.

Our Year 12 students attended a Leadership Day, where they benefited from a dedicated day focused on leadership skills and personal development. This event aimed to equip students with the necessary tools to become effective leaders, both within the school community and beyond.

Globally, OneSchool has implemented a Campus Culture Rubric, which is pivotal in standardizing and enhancing campus culture across all sites. This rubric ensures consistency in our approach to building a positive and supportive school environment. It is closely linked to Campus Road Maps and is informed by data from our Global Surveys, which provide insights into various aspects of school life and help us identify areas for improvement.

The introduction of the Child Protection Online Monitoring System (CPOMS) has significantly bolstered our child protection measures, ensuring that we have robust systems in place to safeguard the wellbeing of our students. This system allows for efficient reporting and monitoring of child protection issues, enhancing our ability to respond swiftly and effectively.

Staff wellbeing continues to be a pivotal part of our school culture. We have implemented a regional Staff Recognition Program to acknowledge and reward the valuable contributions of our staff. This program is instrumental in fostering a positive work environment and ensuring that our staff feel valued and appreciated. We also recognize and celebrate special days such as National Admin Day, World Teachers' Day, and National Principals' Day, with enthusiastic participation from our students who take the initiative to organize events and celebrations to honour our staff.

Our Year 12 students set an ambitious ATAR goal of 80, with a regional target of 74. We were impressed with their overall mean of 78.89, which reflects their hard work and dedication. Students demonstrated a strong understanding across all subjects, and we were particularly pleased with their external examination results. This exceptional academic progress is consistently reflected in our Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) data, which demonstrates excellent student growth and achievement.

The "Learning to Learn" framework continues to play a pivotal role in how our lessons are designed and facilitated for our students. This framework emphasizes student-centred learning, critical thinking, and the development of lifelong learning skills. The introduction of student-initiated tutorials through the Canvas platform has had a significant impact not only on students' academic learning but also on building stronger relationships between students and teachers. This innovative approach allows students to take charge of their learning, seek help when needed, and engage more deeply with the material.

The successes and positive outcomes of this year are attributed to the collaborative efforts, unwavering support, and remarkable teamwork of all stakeholders, including the State Board, Mr. Paul Maher, and our dedicated teaching and nonteaching staff. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to everyone involved, including our incredible CA team, dedicated students, supportive parents, and the wider community. Their contributions have been instrumental in shaping our school's achievements throughout the year. We look forward to building on this momentum and continuing our journey of growth and excellence in the coming years.

The average student attendance rate for the whole school in 2023 was 91.05%.

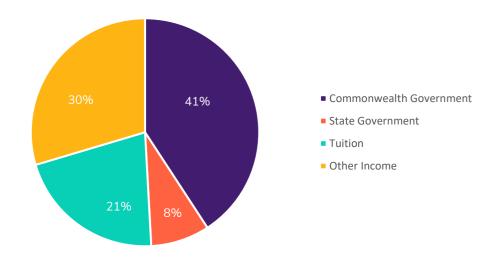
