

Our end-of-year Recognition of Excellence Ceremony & Year 12 Graduation Ceremony, held on Monday 4th December, was a resounding success. This year we connected with all campuses across Australia. This was an exciting change and highlighted the work taking place to move to a regional school in all aspects of operations. It was great to acknowledge the outstanding achievements of our students and witness some entertaining musical items. Cross-campus Visits were again a big factor in the success of our teaching team and the learning outcomes of our students. CCVs afford our staff and students the opportunity to collaborate with their teachers and peers from across the state, and interstate! Our students have also taken part in various educational incursions and excursions to further develop their understanding of their courses.

Professional learning plays a pivotal role in ensuring that our entire staff remains wellinformed and proficient in key areas. 
Both students and parents appreciate the efforts by staff to create best possible outcomes for students, and they feel part of a safe, supportive and positive learning environment.

#### Western Australian Certificate of Education and ATAR

#### **WACE Achievement**

In 2023 OneSchool Global WA had a total of 22 graduating students and all students were eligible to achieve a Western Australian Certificate of Education. From the eligible students, 22 (100%) achieved WACE. This was an outstanding achievement and above the state average of 92.7%.

14 students (63.6%) were on an ATAR pathway, and 8 students (36.3%) were on a General pathway. In 2023 the state average for students achieving an ATAR was 39.6%. OneSchool Global WA continues to have a higher number of students achieving an ATAR compared to state levels.


